CONIFERS

Techny Arborvitae (*Thuja occidentalis* 'Techny')

A smaller variation of our native arborvitae that stays green through winter. Great for privacy screening, windbreaks and wildlife habitat. Somewhat deer resistant. *Fast growth · 12–15 ft*

Native to the eastern U.S. and Canada. Excellent for screens, windbreaks and wildlife habitat. Does well in poorly drained sites; rot-resistant wood. Bronze winter color. *Fast growth · 25–35 ft*

Balsam Fir (*Abies balsamea*)

Soft, bright green needles, very popular Christmas tree. Symmetric growth needs very little shearing. *Medium growth · 75 ft*

Grows well in shade where other conifers do not. Lustrous soft flat needles closely resemble balsam fir. Long-lived; can be sheared to a thick, dense crown. *Medium growth · 125–150 ft*

HARDWOODS**River Birch** (*Betula nigra*)Excellent ornamental tree, very heat and cold tolerant. Resistant to insects that plague the white birch. Exfoliating cinnamon to light creamy white bark. *Fast growth · 90 ft*

Deeply veined dark waxy green leaves and shiny golden bark make for an impressive specimen. A valuable forest product — if it's made of birch, it's likely yellow birch. Of major ecological value.

Honeycrisp — crisp and juicy with excellent flavor; the new standard in eating apples. **SnowSweet®** — slightly tart, sweet and savory; slow to brown once cut (our favorite). **Frostbite™** — small apple with a very sweet, intense taste; extremely cold hardy; grandparent to Honeycrisp.

Red Regent — super hardy northern apple, perfect combination of tart and sweet; stores well; ripens early October.

Highbush Cranberry (*Viburnum trilobum*)

White flowers in flat clusters in May. Beautiful lustrous green leaves followed by scarlet red fruit and foliage in fall. Returning spring migrants rely on the fermented fruit. *Fast growth · 8–12 ft*

Red Osier Dogwood (*Cornus sericea*)

Thick, lustrous waxy green leaves and coral red stems. Clusters of white flowers and masses of purple-white berries are a favorite of cedar waxwings, bluebirds and many others on their southward migration. Great deer cover and browse. *Fast growth · 8–15 ft*

GOOD TO KNOW**What do the ages mean?**

1-0 / 2-0 / 3-0 — a seedling grown one, two or three years in the seedbed.

2-2, 2-3, 1-1 — a transplant: grown in the seedbed, then transplanted and grown additional years in a transplant bed. Transplants have extra size and root mass — a great choice where weed competition is fierce or larger plants are desired.

RC-1 — a rooted cutting grown one year in our propagation field.

Plug — greenhouse-grown stock with an intact soil plug for easy planting.
